Summer is here and with children out of school there continues to be a need for non-perishable food items. While the Knight do the manual collecting, the whole parish is involved. The food is then taken to the Wallace Food Pantry for distribution as needed by the Presbyterian Church.

Canned veggies seem to be in plentiful supply for the time being thanks to recent Food Lion sales. Other needed items include cereal, peanut butter, canned meats (chicken, tuna, beef), dried and canned beans, pasta, rice, canned pasta (like Chef Boy-ar-dee) and pasta sauce, diced tomatoes, and canned fruit. Food Lion and Piggly Wiggly often have great sales on these items; watch your local paper. Please also be sure to check "sell" dates to ensure freshness.
