FROM FR. ALEX- About CHRIST THE KING

It has been several hundred years since there has been a true monarchy on earth, a monarchy where the king/queen is the sole leader, decision maker, and supreme ruler for the whole country. The closest thing that we have in our modern age to a monarchy is a dictator. In our world today, we have seen the horrors that a dictator can cause a country. Men like Stalin, Lenin, and Saddam Hussein have shown us the terrible things that one human being in their depraved wicked state can do.

The comparison of Christ to a king is astounding to me when I begin to think of the implications it has on my daily life.

If Christ is truly the King of my life that means he is the supreme ruler of me and all that I do. In a kingdom, the subjects do nothing without the approval of the king first. Then the most amazing thing came to me, the king is the keeper of the law, and the only one who has the power to pardon those who break it. As a subject in Christ's kingdom, I broke his law, I deliberately went against the rules that my king has set up.

Blessing of the Child in the Womb Father Alex will be blessing the children in the womb at all the Mass on December 14 and 15, 2013. We celebrate this event on the Third Sunday of Advent, sometimes called Gaudete Sunday (Gaudete means "Rejoice") which reminds the church of the joy that Christ's birth will bring to us. The ceremony, developed by the US Council of Catholic Bishops, is meant to encourage parish prayers for -- and recognition of -- the precious gift of the child in the womb, and to foster respect for human life within society.

Fetal Development of "Matthew" Tradition teaches us Christ was conceived on the Feast of the Annunciation. We will watch the parallel development of "Matthew" in the womb beginning on March 25 (Feast of the Annunciation) until December 25. This series of bulletin messages has been prepared by the diocesan Pro Life Office.

Fetal Development of "Matthew" Bulletin (week 35) Matthew's immune system is really beefing up. Matthew will be ready to fight infections and illnesses right after birth. The amniotic fluid has reached its peak so he has lots of padding. Matthew's skull is pliable and soft, ready for delivery. *I'm going to decide when I will be born.* Mom feels she has to go to the restroom frequently -- the pressure is on. *"He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation...all things were created through him and for him."* (Colossians 1:15-16)



This weekend, the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the *Year of Faith* will conclude. Bishop Burbidge invites all Catholics throughout the Diocese of Raleigh, in union with Pope Francis and the universal Church, to observe this conclusion of the Year of Faith by making a Solemn Profession of Faith at Mass.

Bishop Burbidge Invites Faithful to Consult on Vatican Synod On Family-

In October 2014, Pope Francis will convene a Synod of Bishops to review and discuss Pastoral Challenges to the Family in the Context of Evangelization. In preparation for the Synod, the Holy See has asked Bishops throughout the world to respond to a series of questions, following their broad consultation with others in their dioceses. The Most Reverend Michael F. Burbidge is asking priests, deacons, religious and lay faithful of the Diocese to be part of this important initiative.

The questions from the Holy See are intended to collect "experiences and proposals in proclaiming and living the Gospel of the Family in a credible manner." In 2015, the Vatican will convene a follow-up assembly that will seek to develop "guidelines in the pastoral care of the person and the family."

Among the challenges explored in the survey are: same-sex unions, cohabitation, pastoral programs for divorced and remarried people, pastoral programs for engaged and married couples, and the nullification of marriage process.

It should be noted that the survey is not a public opinion poll, but intended to be a prayerful reflection and response to challenges facing family life. At the beginning of the survey instrument, faithful will find a link to the background catechesis which they are asked to read.

The online instrument will be utilized to collate all responses submitted. Individuals who are unable to answer all of the questions are asked to provide responses to as many questions as possible, especially those which are indicated in bold.
