Fetal Development of Hannah Tradition teaches us Christ was conceived on the Feast of the Annunciation. We will watch the parallel development of "Hannah" in the womb beginning on March 25 (Feast of the Annunciation) until December 25.

Fetal Development of Hannah : April 20 (week 5) Hannah's heart is now pumping blood. All four chambers of the heart are working. The lungs start to appear along with the brain. Arm and leg buds appear. Soon Hannah will be doing somersaults in the spacious world of the womb. Her mother is probably tired and may experience morning sickness as her body adjusts to the baby. 
Holy Week:

Pope Francis to Canonize Blessed John XXIII and John Paul II on April 27, 2014, Divine Mercy Sunday



Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II:
In 2013 Pope Francis announced that John XXIII and John Paul II would be declared saints at a single ceremony on April 27, 2014, Divine Mercy Sunday. The

date is significant because the day is a celebration instituted worldwide by Pope John Paul. Since the beginning of Pope Francis' pontificate, he has emphasized God's mercy. "I think — and I say it with humility — that this is the Lord's most powerful message: mercy," said Pope Francis during his homily on March 17, 2013. John XXIII was beatified on September 3, 2000 by Pope John Paul II. Pope Francis waived the requirement for a second miracle to clear the way for John XXIII's canonization. While Vatican rules require one miracle for beatification and one for canonization, the pope may elect to set the rule aside.

At Pope John Paul's funeral, the crowds shouted "Santo subito" or "Sainthood now!" for the beloved Pope. Pope Benedict XVI waived the traditional 5-year waiting period for the canonization process to begin. John Paul II's beatification, also on Divine Mercy Sunday, was the fastest in history: six years after his death. His second miracle for canonization involved curing a Costa Rican woman cured of a cerebral aneurysm.
