Fetal Development of Hannah Tradition teaches us Christ was conceived on the Feast of the Annunciation. We will watch the parallel development of "Hannah" in the womb beginning on March 25 (Feast of the Annunciation) until December 25.

Fetal Development of Hannah June 15 (week 13) Hannah now sleeps and exercises the muscles energetically. She is able to turn her head, curl her toes, make a fist and open and close her mouth while breathing the amniotic fluid to help develop the respiratory system. While Hannah is active, she is very small, weighing about one ounce. "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you," (Jer. 1: 5)
