From the desk of Fr. Roch...

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

This week, I would like to just offer special thanks to all of you who attended the liturgy of my installation as your pastor last Tuesday. This indeed, I believe, was a special celebration for all of

us. Special thanks to all who made this liturgy possible, who worked hard to "put it all together", as well as those who prepared the reception.

As I was reflecting on the readings for our Sunday mass this weekend, what called my attention was the dialog between God and King Salomon in the First Reading. I, certainly, put this conversation in the context of my arrival here at Transfiguration as your new pastor.

God says, "Ask something of me, and I will give it to you."
Salomon answered, "... give your servant, therefore, an understanding heart (...) to distinguish right from wrong..."
Salomon is asking God for wisdom, that God may act in him and through him for the well being of the people entrusted in his care.

Just like Salomon, I am asking God to give me the gifts and wisdom necessary to be a good pastor, good shepherd, good herald of Jesus Christ and his Gospel. In the Gospel today, Jesus says that "the Kingdom of God is like a treasure buried in the field... or like a pearl of great price..." It is my hope and my prayer that we all, as a community will continue to cherish the "treasure of our faith". We will grow together in the faith, wisdom, and the love and God and neighbor. Finance Committee Update:

2013-2014 Budget Summary: Operating:

Total Revenue \$147,230 Budget: \$145,630 +\$ 1,600 01%

Total Expense: \$157,140 Budget: \$145730 -(\$9,809) 07.8%

Last year the budget was set before the elections of the Pastoral Council and the Parish Council/Finance Council Retreat.

Several Expenses were identified that all agreed should have been in the budget:

Cleaning the Church weekly \$350/month \$4200 annual Mowing the Rectory twice a month and the Church weekly: \$2800

The Alter of Repose: \$1800

We underestimated expenses for Priest Auto and Travel: \$7,000 vs. actual of \$12,218

We had sufficient cushion in the 2014 budget to cover all but the \$9809.

The over spending conditions were planned overages and were planned to offset excess cash in the check book (vs. putting it in a low interest bearing savings account). We forecast a \$10,000 overage from early September, 2013.

We, also, were aware that we had not reached the realistic costs of becoming a Parish (financially self sufficient). Summary:

The Expenses and total Revenue came out almost exactly as expected, with no major surprises and we ended the year within the Diocese guideline for cash flow with six weeks

expenses on hand (checking and saving). We also continue to pay down our Cathedral campaign, which once paid off will generate a replacement for savings and cash flow (2016). The current estimate would be between \$10,000 and \$20,000 depending on any defaults or failure to complete payment of commitments to the Campaign for any reason.

The focus for 2015 will be presented next week.

We have an additional 100 tickets available to sell for the <u>Bill Carone Charity Raffle</u> (for a 2014 Mustang) Please contact Mark Hopkins for information/tickets. When purchasing a ticket please ask: "Does this benefit Transfiguration of Jesus Parish?" because over three thousand tickets will be distributed to various groups for sale. Those sold by the Knights or one of our Parishioners brings 100% back to Transfiguration and is one of our major Fundraisers for 2014-2015
