From the Desk of the Historian: The Cure d Artes Prayer Group asks that we pray for the following priests who have served

Transfiguration of Jesus Catholic Church in the month of December:

Fr. Donald Staib (1961): An educator, Fr. Staib served as superintendent of schools in the Diocese of Raleigh and spent many years in Asia teaching English and the American culture. Fr. Staib founded St. Mary of Magdelene parish in Apex in 1977 and has served there since that time. Fr. Staib celebrated his 50th year in the priesthood in 2011.

Msgr. Steven Carlson (1999-2000): Msgr. Carlson was a former US Army pilot before becoming a priest. He left Transfiguration in 2000 when he was recalled to military service as an Army chaplain. He is currently retired.

Fr. John Alex Gonzalez (2011-2014): From Colombia, Fr. Alex served as pastor at NC State and was chaplain to the football team before coming to Transfiguration. It was during his tenure that Transfiguration was erected as a parish, having previously been a mission of St. Joseph the Worker in Burgaw.

Fr. Marlon Mendieta-Rodas: Fr. Marlon was a parishioner of Transfiguration prior to his entering the seminary in Philadelphia. He was ordained as a priest in 2018 and is now serving a parochial vicar of St. Patrick's in Fayetteville.
